# About the McMaster University Master of Communications Management Program

The MCM program is Canada's leading master's degree for communications professionals, executives, consultants and researchers in the many fields related to communications management including: public relations, marketing, fundraising, digital and social media, public affairs, investor relations, and others.

**You can do the MCM while you work full-time.** The program has been designed for working professionals who have active professional and personal lives. The MCM faculty and staff understand your many commitments and are flexible to enable you to work, live, and study in harmony.

The curriculum provides students with leading-edge education in communications theory and professional practice based on nearly 20 years of delivering the most advanced graduate communications curriculum in Canada.

- 2. Business/Management Core (4 required courses, 12 units)
- 3. Leadership Electives (2 courses, 6 units)
- 4. Capstone Project (1 course, 3 units)

  - Canadian students: \$4,348.83 per 3-credit course (\$8,697.66/term for 2 courses)
  - International students:, \$5,259.24 (or as determined by the Board of Governors) per 3-credit course (\$10,518.48 per term for 2 courses)
  - The full cost of the program is payable on a course-by-course basis and 12 courses are required to graduate.

#### All applicants require:

- Completed online application
- B+ average from recognized university/college and 3+ years of work experience
- References (professional and academic)
- Work sample
- Online interview
- Flexible admission consideration for those that don't meet the above requirements
